Message from Inspector Selvarajah

This month members of the safer neighbourhood team, patrol teams and special constabulary have been working hard in tackling criminality. We have been working with our partners with an ongoing serious crime investigation.

A man responsible for a carjacking in Bressingham from 2017 was also located, arrested and charged. South Norfolk officers successfully arrested, charged and remanded two men following the series of village hall and social club burglaries across Norfolk and Suffolk. This includes the Tacolneston village hall, Carleton Rode village hall and Shotford Bowls Club, Harleston, which was targeted twice. Our rural beat manager and drone pilot has been carrying out pro-active patrols of hare coursers who target our area.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	4	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	2	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	2	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	7	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	11	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	2	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	2	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	1	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been concentrating their time on the 3 areas of concern- Speeding, Anti-social use of motor vehicles and Drugs.

In January we ran a 'traffic' operation on Victoria Road, Diss. During this a vehicle was seized for using 'red diesel', numerous traffic offence reports were issued regarding windscreen tints, using a mobile phone whilst driving as well as other offences.
