To work alongside the Response Team (who deal with 999 / 101 calls for service) and the Safer Neighbourhood Team (who deal with local, problem solving / engagement); we are in the process of recruiting a Neighbourhood Policing Team– who will work proactively to reduce crime in your area. I welcome this change and an extra team to tackle the issues that impact you the most and will keep you posted about their work in the months to come.

I would like to highlight a spike in vehicle damages across the area and issue a reminder to keep any valuables out of sight and park in a well-lit area, if possible. We rely on the support of our communities to remain vigilant and welcome you to report any suspicious activity.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	1	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	3	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	6	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	10	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	5	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	4	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	2	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from you Beat Manager Pc Baker

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been concentrating their time on the 3 - Speeding, Anti-social use of motor vehicles and Drugs.

I am pleased to say that from the last newsletter I have received speed monitoring data from a number of parishes and am concentrating my time at the key times identified. I have requested assistance from the special constabulary who are also conducting speed enforcement based on the results received.

This month I attended a Pubwatch meeting in Diss, a person's name was given to police who had been acting inappropriately at a licenced premise and as a result they have been banned from the pubs of Diss for the next 6 months. This scheme is proving effective in reducing ASB at licenced premises.
